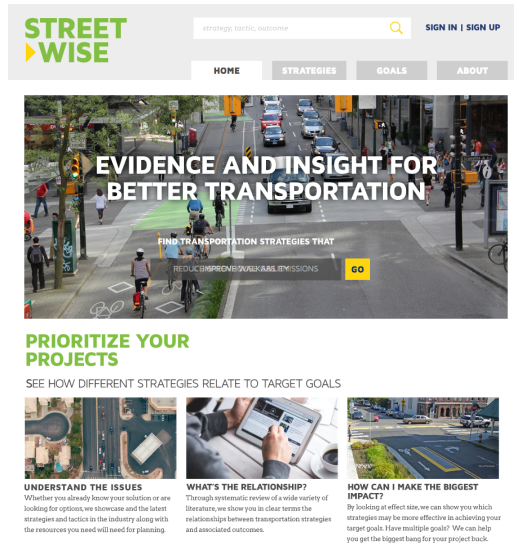


STREETWISE: Evidence and Insight for Better Transportation

Abstract

The relationship between certain transportation strategies, such as complete streets, and the outcomes we want to see in our communities, such as improved safety and health, have been described and documented in the research literature. However, this information isn't readily accessible to the who need it: planners, elected officials, and the communities they serve. An interactive web-based tool, StreetWise, illuminates these relationships in a visually rich and compelling way using the best evidence available.

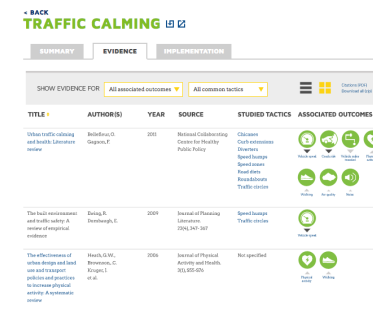
What Is StreetWise?

StreetWise is an online platform that helps people understand the complex relationship between transportation investments and their effects on communities. StreetWise visually illuminates the relationships described in the research through the use of compelling graphics and standardized, easy-to-read descriptions. StreetWise users may search by outcome and by strategy. For each strategy or outcome, StreetWise provides a definition and description, with annotated hyperlinks to support claims. StreetWise displays how transportation strategies affect outcomes through a performance dashboard, which is derived from systematic reviews. The design is especially adept in highlighting how certain strategies offer multiple benefits. Those who want more detail can click through to a table that displays the study findings, and further may click through to the study itself when it is available.

The Value of StreetWise

StreetWise helps civic leaders evaluate and prioritize transportation investments, defend innovation, and learn from case studies to successfully implement projects and programs. Below describes how StreetWise meets the needs of planners, elected officials, researchers, and advocates:

- **Understandable:** We synthesize and communicate research into a standardized and easy-to-read format
- **Time-saver:** We collect scattered research and put in one easy-to-find place

- **Defend/validate:** We give you the facts you need to defend your decisions

We Need Your Help

Our priority right now is to index literature from systematic reviews for inclusion into the StreetWise database. We're looking for faculty interested in using StreetWise as part of their curriculum. Students will gather, synthesize, and summarize information from guidebooks and case studies on a topic of interest to them. Internships are unpaid, but students acknowledged on their reports that will be published on StreetWise. Three internships per term are awarded. Course credit may be available, depending on your institution. Masters students working on a final project are encouraged to apply.
